

## Long-Term Athlete Development & Windows of Trainability

Happy Holidays everyone! This is the unofficial halfway point of our 2016-17 hockey season. It's a chance to take a break, enjoy the company of our family and friends, and fill our hearts with the holiday spirit. As we move into the second half of the hockey season, I'd like to touch base on Long-Term Athlete Development. We take player development very seriously, and we try to use as much scientific childhood development research as possible when designing our program.

Long-Term Athletic Development is a step-by-step process that describes the things athletes need to be doing at specific ages and stages. (<a href="http://canadiansportforlife.ca/learn-about-canadian-sport-life/ltad-stages">http://canadiansportforlife.ca/learn-about-canadian-sport-life/ltad-stages</a>) Window of trainability refers to the point in age or stage when training a specific capacity has the optimal effect. (<a href="http://www.admkids.com/page/show/990393-w-windows-of-trainability">http://www.admkids.com/page/show/990393-w-windows-of-trainability</a>) Below you will find a very brief summary of each stage as it relates to youth hockey.

- 8U Optimal windows of trainability are Speed-1 and Suppleness. Speed-1 is stopping, starting, changing of direction, and quickness. Suppleness is focusing on a wide range of motion and flexibility. Additional areas of emphasis should be Agility, Balance, and Coordination. For Character Development players need to: learn the rules of the team; respect their coaches, parents, and teammates; begin building the foundation of a strong work ethic. Practices should be 85% individual skill development (skating, passing, stick handling, shooting, and body contact) and 15% hockey sense (teaching concepts through small area games).
- 10U Optimal windows of trainability are Speed-1, Suppleness, and Skill Acquisition. This is the beginning of the "Golden Age of Skill Development". There is no better time in the player's life to acquire and develop sport skills. For Character Development players need to: demonstrate high levels of sportsmanship; respect for their coaches, teammates, officials, and parents; start learning the balance of family, school, and activities; learn how to be on time for practices and games. Practices should be 75% individual skill improvement, 15% hockey sense, and 10% team-play (working with teammates inside a system).
- 12U Optimal windows of trainability are Skill Acquisition, Speed-2 for girls (high velocity training for top-end speed), and Stamina for girls (endurance and recovery). 12U is all about skill, skill, skill! This age sets the bar for how agile, balanced, and coordinated the player will be as an adult. For Character Development players need to: understand the benefits of positive comments as it relates to reduced stress levels, enhanced self-image, and enjoyment in the game; learn the importance of balancing family, school, and activities; learn how to be on time for practices and games; take responsibility for their performances and actions. Practices should be 65% individual skill improvement (including body contact), 25% hockey sense, and 10% team-play.
- 14U Optimal windows of trainability are Speed-2, Stamina, and Strength for girls. There should be an added emphasis on stride length, stride frequency, form, and top-end effort. For Character Development players need to: understand the importance of honesty and integrity; accept responsibility for their performance and actions; learn coping strategies to deal with adversity; balance family, school, and activities; develop a sense of team commitment. Practices should be 50% individual skill improvement, 35% hockey sense, and 15% team-play.

16/18U - Optimal windows of trainability are Speed-2, Stamina for boys, and Strength. There should be an added emphasis on learning to compete and off-ice strength building. For Character Development players need to: understand the importance of honesty and integrity; accept responsibility for their performance and actions; learn coping strategies to deal with adversity; balance family, school, and activities; and develop a sense of team commitment. Players should also develop a pre-game routine, focus on things they can control, give maximum effort, understand the benefits of self-talk, relaxation exercises, basic visualization skills, and goal setting. Practices should be 50% individual skill improvement, 25-30% hockey sense, and 20-25% team-play.

Our goal is to provide an atmosphere that takes all this information into account when training our athletes. Sacrificing windows of trainability for short-term goals is a huge injustice to the player's full potential. We hope to see beyond the wins and losses, and instead focus on key stages and ages to develop our players both physically and mentally.




