

#### Defense, Offense, and Goalie Camp

June 19-22: birth years 2000-2005

June 26-29: birth years 2004-2010

Players will work on position specific training. In the morning ice session, players will work on proper footwork and puck management as it relates to their position. During the second ice session, we will bring all the players together to work on game scenarios and competition drills.

#### 14U & 16U AA/AAA Training Camp

July 24-27: birth years 2000-2004

This camp is designed for any player interested in trying out for an AA or AAA Bantam or Midget team. This is an intense and fast paced camp that will push your player beyond their comfort zone.

#### Boot Camp

August 7-10: birth years 2000-2006

This camp will prepare peewees through midgets for the upcoming season. There will be lots of skating and puck work, intense dry land, and skill/battle stations. We call it boot camp for a reason!

#### Beginner Boot Camp

August 21-24: birth years 2011-2007

This is an introductory boot camp for our younger players. The players will be pushed and have fun at the same time. A great opportunity for the 10U players to prepare for tryouts!

#### Hockey Week Across America Less Than Two Weeks Away Registration Open for More Than 350 "Try Hockey for Free" Events

**COLORADO SPRINGS, Colo.** — USA Hockey will lead the nation in the first-ever <u>Hockey Week</u> <u>Across America</u>, <u>February 19-26</u>. The week-long event is to commemorate the 10th anniversary of Hockey Weekend Across America.

"We're excited to expand this grand celebration of our sport to a week for the 10th anniversary," said **Dave Ogrean**, executive director of USA Hockey. "We have so many people across the country at all levels that do so much and this week provides an excellent opportunity for associations and teams to honor them in their communities. It's also a time to focus on giving new people a chance to try or perhaps see our sport for the very first time. Hockey is a growing part of the fabric of our sports culture in America and we look forward to sharing all the great things hockey offers to more and more families in communities across the country."

The week-long celebration of hockey includes a special theme for each day.

NBC Sports' *Hockey Day in America* kicks off the festivities on Sunday, Feb. 19, with live coverage of four NHL games and content showcasing hockey at all levels weaved in througout the day and night. Coverage begins at 12 noon ET with a half-hour pre-game show on NBC in advance of two games on the network -- Washington at New York Rangers followed by Detroit at Pittsburgh. NBCSN takes over duties for two evening games on Sunday, with the Boston at San Jose contest following Chicago at Buffalo.

From Monday, Feb. 20, through Thursday, Feb. 23, Hockey Week Across America will feature daily 'Salutes' to recognize members of the hockey community. USA Hockey encourages the hockey community -- including fans, associations and teams -- to participate in their own unique ways in 'Salute to Players' on Monday; 'Salute to Coaches' on Tuesday; 'Salute to Officials' on Wednesday; and Salute to Local Rinks' on Thursday.

<u>Friday, Feb. 24</u>, is "Wear Your Favorite Jersey Day," sponsored by <u>ShopUSAHockey.com</u>, where fans are encouraged to show their hockey pride by wearing their prized hockey jerseys. USA Hockey's Facebook and Twitter pages will accept photos from all in search of the most passionate hockey fans.

The focus shifts to engaging new players and fans on Saturday, Feb. 25, as part of Try Hockey Day. A centerpiece of the activities that day features a national Try Hockey for Free Day to provide children ages 4 to 9 that have never had the chance to try the sport to do just that at no cost. Hundreds of rinks nationwide will be hosting a Try Hockey for Free event and those interested can find the location nearest them by visiting <a href="TryHockeyForFree.com">TryHockeyForFree.com</a>. Liberty Mutual Insurance and Total Hockey are official sponsors of USA Hockey's Try Hockey for Free days.

To cap off the week, "Celebrate Local Hockey Heroes Day" on Sunday, Feb. 26, encourages all involved in the game to develop ways to honor their local hockey heroes. USA Hockey invites fans to post pictures and stories on its Facebook and Twitter pages.

At 13 NHL games in American cities as part of Hockey Week Across America, two young officials will have the chance to meet with NHL officials working the particular contest prior to the game and then stay to watch those NHL officials in action.

Basic skating skills are needed before joining this program. A hockey helmet with face mask, hockey gloves and a stick are required – elbow pads and knee pads are recommended. We will be offering the following sessions through July 20, 2017:



#### **SAYHA Parent Code Of Conduct**

As a parent, you understand it is important for your child to get the most out of participating in youth sports. To ensure your child has an enjoyable experience, youth hockey aims to deliver these promises:

- 1. **FUN.** The thrill of carrying the puck up the ice, the exhilaration of scoring their first goal or the camaraderie of skating with friends is possible due to the fun and encouraging environment youth hockey provides to try new things and grow as a person.
- 2. **GUIDANCE.** Youth hockey is unique because a new player must start from the very basics of essentially learning to walk again. Our youth hockey program has instructors and coaches that are able to teach the challenging skills of ice hockey in a fun, engaging manner.
- 3. **ACHIEVEMENT.** You will be amazed at the progress your child will make in a short amount of time. Both you and your child will walk away from the rink each time excited about all the new things that your young (and even experienced!) hockey player has learned on the ice.



To achieve these promises, Spokane Youth Hockey needs your help. As a parent or guardian of a Spokane Youth Hockey player, you have a responsibility to:

- 1 Ensure to the best of your ability that your child abides by the rules of hockey, the policies of SAYHA and principles of good sportsmanship.
- 2 Ensure to the best of your ability that your child respects his/her teammates, coaches, team officials, referees, opponents, opposing coaches, opposing team officials and other participants in SAYHA games, practices and other association activities.
- 3 Ensure to the best of your ability that your child conducts himself/herself in a manner that minimizes the risk of injury, both physical and psychological, to himself/herself and others which includes refraining absolutely from making any derogatory comments as to another individual's race, ethnic origin, color, religion, gender and/or sexual orientation.
- 4 Refrain from criticism of coaches, team officials, referees, teammates, opponents, opposing coaches, opposing team officials and other participants in SAYHA games and other association activities and, when you feel that criticism is warranted, you shall offer it in a manner that is fully respectful, through proper channels and away from the hockey rink.

- 5 Refrain from directing comments which are insulting, intimidating, humiliating, hurtful, malicious, degrading or otherwise offensive to players, team officials, referees and association volunteers including but not restricted to divisional coordinators, board members, executive members (directors) and paid association staff. If you feel that criticism of any such person is warranted, you shall offer it in a manner that is fully respectful, through proper channels and away from the hockey rink.
- 6 Refrain from discussing the weaknesses of other team players and/or coaching staff with your child.
- 7 Familiarize yourself with, and abide by the policies and procedures, of SAYHA.



In addition to these standards, USA HOCKEY also outlines a parent's responsibility in the PARENT CODE OF CONDUCT:

- 2 Do not force your children to participate in sports, but support their desires to play their chosen sports. Children are involved in organized sports for **their** enjoyment. Make it fun.
- 3 Encourage your child to play by the rules. Remember, children learn best by example, so applaud the good plays of both teams.
- 4 Do not embarrass your child by yelling at players, coaches or officials. By showing a positive attitude toward the game and all of its participants, your child will benefit.
- 5 Emphasize skill development and practices and how they benefit your young athlete. Deemphasize games and competition in the lower age groups.
- 6 Know and study the rules of the game and support the officials on and off the ice. This approach will help in the development and support of the game. Any criticism of the officials only hurts the game.
- 7 Applaud a good effort in both victory and defeat, and enforce the positive points of the game. Never yell or physically abuse your child after a game or practice – it is destructive. Work toward removing the physical and verbal abuse in youth sports.
- 8 Recognize the importance of volunteer coaches. They are important to the development of your child and the sport.
- 9 Communicate with your child's coach and support them.
- 10 If you enjoy the game, learn all you can about hockey and volunteer.
